The Lansing Symphony Orchestra's chamber performances were established in 1987 under the artistic direction of I-Fu Wang and grew into the Renaud Chamber Music Society. Under the guidance of Music Director Timothy Muffitt (*Smart Office Systems Chair*) and Artistic Director Richard Sherman (*Bruce & Virginia Allen Chair*), the series is now known as the Lansing Symphony Chamber Series. The series is designed to showcase the artistry of LSO members in an intimate setting and to introduce audiences to some of mid-Michigan's most talented artists and ensembles.

The 2008/2009 Chamber Series is generously sponsored by the Wilbur & Ruth Wright Charitable Fund.

The Lansing Symphony Orchestra was established in 1929 and will soon celebrate its 80th season. More than 20,000 people attend LSO concerts each year, and more than 50,000 listeners are able to hear broadcasts of the orchestra's performances by NPR affiliate WKAR-FM Radio. The LSO's highly acclaimed education programs reach 15,000 students in kindergarten through 12th grade in five counties.
